high prevalence of disorders due to psychoactive substance use

drug-therapy is the most popular treatment



sedative-hypnotic properties

short-term treatment: 2-4 weeks⁷

indications: **insomnia**, **anxiety**, muscle relaxation^{7,8}

troubling side effects of BZDs

increased risk of accidents, including falls






